Why register animals and submit health forms?

If a member is planning to use their project animal(s) for any 4-H event that takes place throughout the 4-H program year, then the animal(s) must be registered. Events could be club meetings, outreach programs, educational events, shows, fairs, etc. Animals in the members household that are not being used in 4-H in anyway do not have to be registered, nor do health forms need to be submitted. **PLEASE NOTE: Animal Registration forms are <u>not</u> fair entry forms.**

Due Dates

Animal registration begins at the start of the 4-H program year annually on September 1. All members have until the due dates to submit forms. Please refer to the project area within this packet to determine the due date. Should a due date fall on a weekend for a particular year, then the due date will be pushed to the following Monday. New 4-H members joining after these due dates will not be able to register animal(s) until September.

Project Events

Each project area highlights New Jersey 4-H events available. Some events may or may not happen each year, so is important to follow the New Jersey 4-H Calendar <u>https://nj4h.rutgers.edu/</u> Any event highlighted in **GREEN** welcomes any 4-H member to participate, whether they are in that specific project area or not.

New Jersey Department of Agriculture

- There are three project areas within this section:
 - Seeing Eye Puppy Raising Project:
 - This project area is a partnership between 4-H and The Seeing Eye, Inc.
 - Both youth and adults can be members of a Seeing Eye 4-H club. Only the youth are considered 4-H members. Members receive puppies to raise for about 1 1.5 years before returning to The Seeing Eye, Inc. for formal training. There are many rules set by The Seeing Eye, Inc. that must be followed by the puppy raising families (i.e. cannot interact with non-Seeing Eye dogs before X weeks due to health concerns). Members must remember that they are not raising dogs for pets, they are future tools and are a major investment of time, resources, and finances.
 - These members only compete in Seeing Eye 4-H shows which test the puppy's skills against The Seeing Eye, Inc. expectation for that age group.
 - Canine Care and Training Project:
 - This project area is for all dogs not involved with the Seeing Eye Project. It focuses on care and training.
 - Feline Project:
 - This project area is for cats.
 - Though there are currently no New Jersey State Level 4-H Feline events, a committee can always be created and shows arranged. This does not mean the member cannot use their animal as a project animal. They are still welcome to set goals to learn about behavior and care.

4-H MEMBERSHIP:

- Cloverbuds: Youth Grades K 3.
- Junior division: Youth grades 4 8.
- Senior division: Youth grades 9 13.
- All members must be a 4-H Member In Good Standing to participate in 4-H events.

REGISTRATION/ID:

- All Canine and Feline Projects must submit a New Jersey 4-H Animal Registration form to the county 4-H office OR submit a registration electronically through 4Honline due by April 1 annually.
- The registration should include a New Jersey 4-H lease/borrow form if the member is not the owner of the animal. Forms can be found at the end of this packet.

HEALTH: All canines must be current on health requirements and present proof of vaccinations. A vaccine record is due to the county 4-H office by April 1 annually for:

- Canine distemper, parvovirus, hepatitis, and rabies. *Rabies can only be administered by an accredited veterinarian.*
- All canines and felines are subject to a visual health inspection by the designated health inspector prior to an event no exceptions.

- There are four project areas within this section:
 - Sheep Project.
 - Goat Project:
 - Intact males (non-castrated) over the age of 3 months are not permitted as exhibition animals – only females and castrated males
 - Horned animals –Dairy goats must be polled/debudded/dehorned. Meat/Fiber/Companion goats are permitted to be horned.
 - Llama Project and Alpaca Project:
 - Though there are currently no New Jersey State Level 4-H Llama/Alpaca events, a committee can always be created and shows arranged. This does not mean the member cannot use their animal as a project animal. They are still welcome to set goals to learn about behavior and care.

4-H MEMBERSHIP:

- Cloverbuds: Youth Grades K 3.
- Junior division: Youth grades 4 8.
- Senior division: Youth grades 9 13.
- All members must be a 4-H Member in Good Standing to participate in 4-H events.

REGISTRATION/ID:

- All Small Ruminant Projects must submit a New Jersey 4-H Animal Registration form to the county 4-H office OR submit a registration electronically through 4Honline due by May 1 annually.
- The registration should include a NJ 4-H lease/borrow form if the member is not the owner of the animal. Forms can be found at the end of this packet.
- <u>By the New Jersey Department of Agriculture</u>: Sexually intact Sheep and Goats shall be identified by USDA approved ear tag, tattoo, and/or microchip. A microchip must be a USDA-approved ISO 11784/85 compliant device. If a microchip is used for ID, the animal owner must bring the microchip reader to the event.

HEALTH: All Small Ruminant projects must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) or Animal Health Certificate (AHC) signed by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of a show or event. In addition, the following is required:

- All Small Ruminants are subject to a visual health inspection by the designated health inspector prior to an event no exceptions.
- Please refer to the New Jersey Department of Agriculture for health forms and requirements of food animals and imported animals. This document can be found on page 1.

- There is one project area within this section: Swine project.
 - Though there are currently no New Jersey State Level 4-H Swine events, a committee can always be created and shows arranged. This does not mean the member cannot use their animal as a project animal. They are still welcome to set goals to learn about behavior and care.

4-H MEMBERSHIP:

- Cloverbuds: Youth Grades K 3.
- Junior division: Youth grades 4 8.
- Senior division: Youth grades 9 13.
- All members must be a 4-H Member In Good Standing to participate in 4-H events.

REGISTRATION/ID:

- All Swine Projects must submit a New Jersey 4-H Animal Registration form to the county 4-H office OR submit a registration electronically through 4Honline due by May 1 annually.
- The registration should include a New Jersey 4-H lease/borrow form if the member is not the owner of the animal. Forms can be found at the end of this packet.

HEALTH: All swine must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) or Animal Health Certificate (AHC) signed by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of a show or event. In addition, the following is required:

- All swine are subject to a visual health inspection by the designated health inspector prior to an event no exceptions.
- Please refer to the New Jersey Department of Agriculture for health forms and requirements of food animals and imported animals. This document can be found on page 1.

 - Though there are currently no New Jersey State Level 4-H Beef Cattle events, a committee can always be created and shows arranged. This does not mean the member cannot use their animal as a project animal. They are still welcome to set goals to learn about behavior and care.
 - Intact males (non-castrated) are not permitted as exhibition animals only females and castrated males

- Junior division: Youth grades 4 8.
- Senior division: Youth grades 9 13.
- All members must be a 4-H Member In Good Standing to participate in 4-H events.

REGISTRATION/ID:

- All Large Ruminants must submit a New Jersey 4-H Animal Registration form to the county 4-H office OR submit a registration electronically through 4Honline due by May 1 annually.
- The registration should include a New Jersey 4-H lease/borrow form if the member is not the owner of the animal. Forms can be found at the end of this packet.

HEALTH: All Large Ruminants must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) or Animal Health Certificate (AHC) signed by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days of a show or event. In addition, the following is required:

- All Large Ruminants are subject to a visual health inspection by the designated health inspector prior to an event no exceptions.
- Please refer to the New Jersey Department of Agriculture for health forms and requirements of food animals and imported animals. This document can be found on page 1.



EQUINE PROJECT



GENERAL:

- There are five project areas within this section:
 - Horse Project
 - Pony Project
 - Very Small Equine (VSE) Project
 - Donkey Project and Mule Project
- No in-tact males (non-castrated) are permitted for all project areas in this section.
- Age of competitive Equine projects:
 - Horse projects must be at least 4 years of age to compete in mounted classes.
 - VSE must be 3 years old to compete in In-Hand Jumping and In-Hand Trail classes.
 - All equines under 4 years of age may compete in Grooming & Showmanship and Halter classes.
- Equine height:
 - Horses are defined as exceeding 14.2 hands
 - Ponies are 14.2 hands and under (Large 13.2 hands to 14.2 hands; Medium 12.2 hands to 13.2 hands; Small 12.2 hands and under)
 - $\circ~$ VSE 39" or less
 - All equines 14.2 hands and under must be measured at the county qualifying show annually up to (and including) their 6th year of age. A permanent card is given to the equine at age 7.

4-H MEMBERSHIP:

- Cloverbuds: Youth Grades K 3.
- Junior division: Youth grades 4 8.
- Senior division: Youth grades 9 13.
- All members must be a 4-H Member In Good Standing to participate in 4-H events.
- *Note* The Model Horse project is different: Juniors are grades 4 7. Seniors are grades 8 13.

REGISTRATION/ID:

- All Equine Projects must submit a New Jersey 4-H Animal Registration form to the county 4-H office OR submit a registration electronically through 4Honline due by April 1 annually.
- The registration should include a New Jersey 4-H lease/borrow form if the member is not the owner of the animal. Forms can be found at the end of this packet.

HEALTH: All equines are to have a Negative Coggins within 12 months of the New Jersey State 4-H Horse Show (SHS) held in August. Colored copies are only accepted (no black and white) and due to the county 4-H office by May 20 annually. No emailed copies or copies displayed on a phone will be accepted the day of the show/event. All equines are to submit a 4-H Horse Health Form with the following vaccinations:

- Eastern and Western Encephalitis vaccination (Administered within 12 months of the SHS)
- Tetanus vaccination (Administered within 12 months of the SHS)
- Rabies vaccination (Administered within 12 months of the SHS)
- West Nile Virus vaccination (Administered within 12 months of the SHS)
- Equine Influenza vaccination (Administered within 6 months of the SHS)
- Equine Herpesvirus (or rhinopneumonitis) (Administered within 6 months of the SHS)
- All equines are subject to a visual health inspection by the designated health inspector prior to an event no exceptions.

REGISTRATION/ID:

- All Small Stock must submit a New Jersey 4-H Animal Registration form to the county 4-H office OR submit a registration electronically through 4Honline due by May 1 annually.
- The registration should include a New Jersey 4-H lease/borrow form if the member is not the owner of the animal. Forms can be found at the end of this packet.
- Registration to also include the following:
 - **Rabbit/Cavy-** Must be identified by a left ear tag, left ear tattoo, or by photograph.
 - **Poultry-** Must be identified by leg band number or by photograph.
 - Small Animal/Herpetology/Other- Must be identified by photograph. Any exotic small animal that requires a permit must submit a copy to their county 4-H office. To find out if the project animal is in need for a permit, visit https://www.state.nj.us/dep/fgw/exotic_apps.htm

HEALTH: All animals must have appropriate health forms completed and signed by May 1 annually:

- Rabbit/Cavy/Small Animal/Poultry- New Jersey 4-H Health Form
- Herpetology- New Jersey 4-H Herpetology Health Form
- **Poultry-** Must originate from a Pollorum-Typhoid clean flock and shall have an individual negative Pullorum-Typhoid test performed within 90 days of the show/event.
 - Poultry and Game Birds shall be tested when more than 4 months of age.
 - Turkeys shall be tested when more than 12 weeks of age.
 - Emus shall be tested when more than 12 months of age.
 - Waterfowl, Pigeons, Doves, Parakeets, and Parrots are exempt from testing.
- All animals are subject to a visual health inspection by the designated health inspector prior to an event – no exceptions
